





What makes the boats of Pulau Duyong unique is that the vessels are built fully out of wood and nailed together using paku naga, wooden pegs that are claimed to be stronger than iron nails.







These days, it is difficult to get youths involved with the boat-building trade. The months-long process of building a boat can be laborious and not many have patience for the finer details of this craft. While there is a general lack of youthful presence at these shipyards, there are an encouraging few who take apprenticeship under these boatbuilders out of pure interest and love for the craft.






